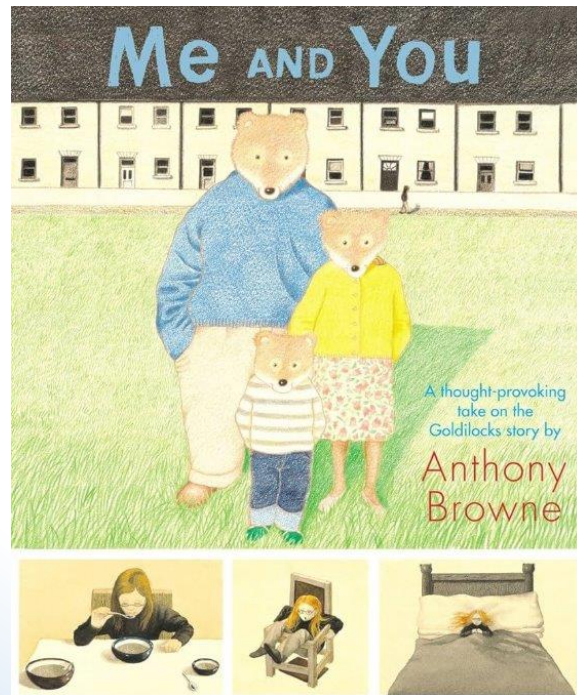

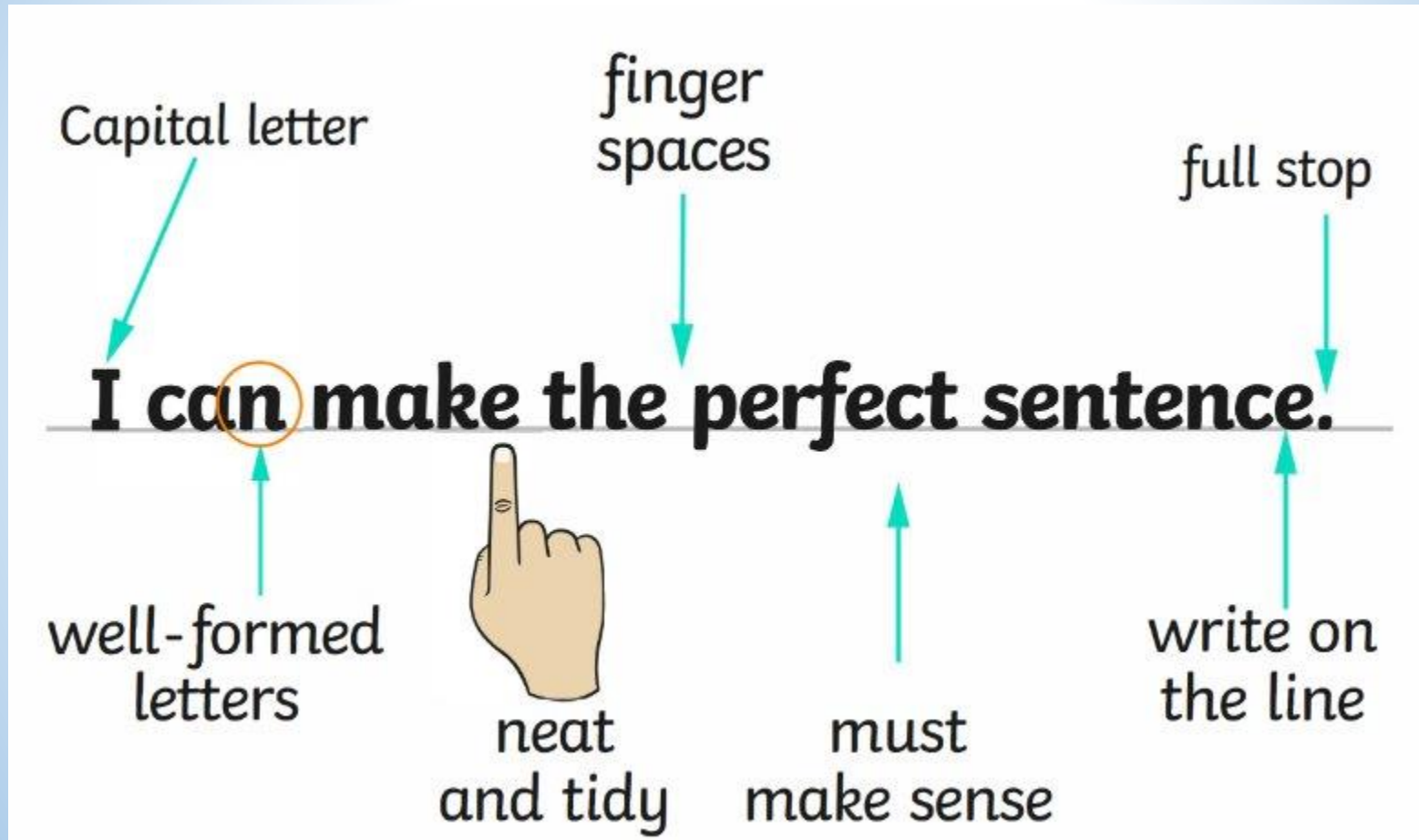
# Literacy

In literacy we have been exploring Goldilocks by Lauren Child. This week we will be creating a story from Goldilocks perspective in the story Me and You by Anthony Browne.






