Please do not worry about the technical language, this can be quite confusing for the children. Just as long as they understand the differences between each sentence type.

Do you remember the letter we found in our classroom from the Secret Gardener? Now look at it to spot different sentence types:

Statements

Statements are sentences which tell you something. They end with a full stop

Rainbows have 7 colours.
They are beautiful to look at.

Dear Year 4s,

Commands

Commands are sentences that tell you to do something. They are found in instructions but can also be urgent or angry and can be very short

Help me!
Please stop doing that.

Questions

Questions are sentences that ask you something. They usually end with a question mark

What did you have for dinner?

Exclamations

An exclamation is a sentence beginning with 'What' or 'How'. It is a full sentence, including a verb, which ends with an exclamation mark.

What amazing children they are!



How kind of him to do that!

HERE ARE SOME IDEAS YOU CAN USE:



Questions (Interrogative):

How concerned are you about pollution?

Do you think pollution has an impact on your health?

What can you do to stop pollution?

Statements (Declarative):

Pollution is when something is added to the environment that is harmful or poisonous to living things.

There are four main types of pollution: air, water, noise, and soil or land pollution.

Emotions (Exclamatory):

It is scary!

What a disaster this is!

Please help us stop pollution!

Commands (Imperative):

Stop pollution now.

Pick up your rubbish, put it in the bin.
